DR. VRANJES LAMPARFUM

Guidance for use

To Use

1. Fill the Lamparfum half way with the Lamparfum fragrance (overfilling the Lamp, causes the wick to absorb too much liquid, making the burner wet and in turn requiring the stone to be left burning for longer).
2. For first use of the Lamparfum, or if the wick has become completely dry, the wick needs to soak in the fragrance for at least 30 minutes before it is ready to use.
3. Light the burner and leave it lit for as long as it takes the stone to turn a light grey colour. You will know when this has happened as the flame will subside considerably compared to when first lit it. The grey colour indicates that the burner has reached the correct temperature for catalytic combustion and at this point, the flame can be blown out and the cover placed over the stone. Once the room has been fragranced to the required level, carefully remove the cover, bearing in mind it might still be hot, and close it off with the metal cap.

Facts

Dr. Vranjes Lamparfum fragrances, through catalytic combustion, are diffused in a much more energetic way than Reed Diffusers. They saturate the environment in a much shorter time; it only takes 20 to 40 minutes, depending upon the size of the room.

The average life of a wick is about is approximately 3000 hours or 200 ignitions. New wicks can be purchased separately.

The Lamparfum fragrances have the same composition as the Dr. Vranjes Reed Diffusers however, because of the catalytic combustion, some notes (especially the fruity ones like Arancio & Cannella, Vaniglia & Mandarino, Melograno and Rosso Nobile) can smell slightly different to the Reed Diffuser version.

Warnings

1. The Lamparfum Fragrance can be used with other lamps, but you MUST use the Dr. Vranjes catalytic wick as they have been made specifically to work with his fragrances.
2. Never touch the stone when the lamp is on.
3. 30 minutes is enough to fragrance a room of approx. 30 sqm
4. Do not move the Lamp when it is hot.
5. Keep the Lamp out of the reach of children and pets.
